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Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 30 June 2019

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 30 June 2019. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The object of the trust is to support recreation and sport in the catchment area of the lochdar school, in particular:

- to promote interest and participation in sport, and related recreations in the catchment area of lochdar School, especially in the interests of education, social welfare and health.
- to assist in the coordination of various sports clubs and recreational organisations operating in the catchment area of lochdar school, both generally and in relation to specific projects.
- to examine the available sports and recreation facilities in the lochdar area as against current and anticipated need and to make application to the local council, local enterprise company and any other appropriate body in this connection.
- to liaise with the council's sports development staff in furtherance of these objects.
- to raise funds for such charitable purposes as the association may deem appropriate.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

In May 2019 we met for our AGM, reviewing activity for 2017 to 2018 and setting our aims for the year ahead.

Our main object remains to support recreation and sport in the catchment are of lochdar School. We do this as follows:

- 1. To promote interest and participation in sport, and related recreation in the catchment area of lochdar School, especially in the interests of education, social welfare and health.
- 2. To assist in the coordination of various sports clubs and recreational organisations operating in the catchment area of lochdar school, both generally and in relation to specific projects.
- To examine the available sports and recreation facilities in the lochdar area as against current and anticipated need and to make applications to the local council, local enterprise company and any other appropriate body in this connection.
- To liaise with the councils sports development staff in furtherance of these objects.
- 5. To raise funds for such charitable purposes as the association may deem appropriate.

For 2018 to 2019 we set ourselves the following objectives:

- 1. To continue work on sub-projects relating to the pitch, including mowing, rolling and pitch drainage
- 2. Liaison with the school and council concerning the maintenance of the school grounds and playparks.
- 3. General maintenance of benches and tree planted areas, with a view to planting additional trees.
- 4. To support and participate in projects relating to footpaths in the area, especially the drainage and surface of the path between Griminish and Torlum.
- 5. Liaison with third parties and involving other groups especially potential user groups
- 6. Identify new trustees, to represent more groups in the area.

To continue work on sub-projects relating to the pitch, starting with fencing and mowing the pitch:

- John Linich has provided a grass cutting and pitch rolling service over the last year. The drain that was installed initially is working well, but there is a need for a new perimeter drain.
- Due to scheduling difficulties, we have not been able to attend any meetings of the local football association.
- We have costed out additional drainage and the upgrade of the septic tank, which is a prerequisite for the changing rooms. We are liaising with the Hall Committee re any applications for funding.
- The planning permission has been renewed

Liaison with the school concerning the maintenance of the school grounds and playparks:

- We have retained the services of two local contractors for maintenance around the school.
- We have identified suppliers and products that could be used to upgrade existing facilities.
- Although play park funding has been set aside by the council, we had not been able to apply because of a lack of clarity re process.
- We met with members of the parent council and community council to look at the possibilities of improving the facilities around the school. We re-routed the access path to avoid the wettest areas
- We were unable to work with the council and estate concerning the drainage around the school.

General maintenance of facilities, benches and tree planted areas:

- We continue to keep the path at lochdar road end clear from grass.
- We have been working with the woodland trust concerning additional tree planting and management of existing trees. We have cleared the trees encroaching on paths. We planted an additional thirty trees.
- The damaged bench has been repaired.

To support and participate in projects relating to footpaths in the area:

 We have liaised with the community council concerning their plans to create new safe footpaths and access to the school, in partnership with paths for all and the council.

Liaison with third parties:

- We continue to be members of UCVO
- We remain members of Uist and Barra Sports Council
- We continue to be signed up to SportEd
- We maintain close ties with the community council
- We have kept in contact with Storas Uibhist concerning their community fund, which is still in abeyance.
- We have liaised with the council and related groups concerning the maintenance of facilities. This included a
 presentation from Mr Bernard Chisholm, director of education

- We have kept in contact with the local football association.
- We continue to maintain a website and a Facebook page.

New Trustees:

 We have approached the parent council, local football club, show committee and hall committee to see if we could identify new trustees. Unfortunately, no willing volunteers have put themselves forward.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

The trustees have examined the requirement for free reserves which are those unrestricted funds not invested in fixed assets, designated for specific purposes or otherwise committed but do not yet have a formal policy in place. At the balance sheet date the trust held unrestricted negative funds of £1,490 (2018 - £6,054) of which £4,704 were invested in fixed assets (2018 - £4,879).

The deficit was reversed after the year end with unrestricted income being recieved by the charity.

FUTURE PLANS

The trust's main aim remains to improve opportunities for outdoor activities for children and adults living in the catchment area of lochdair School. Some of the forthcoming projects include:

- Upgrading the pitch at lochdar Hall, including changing rooms and parking
- Maintenance and development of local play facilities
- Further development of the playing fields at lochdar School
- Maintenance and development of local walks including interpretative signage
- Sculpture/outdoor public art installation

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

Sgoil an lochdair agus a'Choimhearsnachd was incorporated as a company limited by guarantee on 9 June 2005, on which date it acquired the entire assets and liabilities of Sgoil an lochdair agus a'Choimhearsnachd, an unincorporated body. The trust was established under a Memorandum of Association which established the objects and powers of the charitable company and it is governed by its Articles of Association. In the event of the trust being wound up, each member may be required to contribute up to £1. The company is recognised as a Scottish charity under reference SC032387.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

Membership is open to all individuals and organisations, with the exception of employees of the trust. Individuals aged 18 or over living in, or a member of an amateur sports or recreational organisation in, the catchment area of the lochdair School are eligible for membership as ordinary members. All other individuals and organisations may become associate members; such members are neither eligible to stand for election to the Board nor to vote at any general meeting.

Subject to the conditions set out in the Articles of Association, the board shall consist of up to three elected trustees, up to three appointed trustees and up to one co-opted trustee, appointed at the AGM. The board may fill any vacancy arising as a result of a retirement until the next AGM.

All trustees and ordinary members, who have paid their current subscription fee, are entitled to take part in any general meetings and each have one vote. The chairperson has an additional casting vote when necessary.

Organisational structure

The board of trustees currently manage the trust.

Risk management

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error.

ACCOUNTING POLICIES 1.

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably. Donations in kind are valued at cost, or the trustees estimation there of, in the period in which the goods or services are received.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful

Heritable property

- not provided, on land and related costs

Leasehold improvements Plant & machinery

- 4% on cost and 2% on cost - 15% on reducing balance

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Rental payments due under operating lease contracts are charged to the SOFA as incurred. Lease commitments at the balance sheet date are disclosed in the notes to the accounts.

'Tree planting maintenance' funds are carried forward to be expended in accordance with the terms of this fund.

The 'Football pitch at lochdar Hall' fund has been carried forward and will be expended after the year end on the costs of constructing a new pitch at lochdar Hall.

The 'General maintenance' fund has been carried forward and will be expended after the year end on the costs of fencing, benches, painting work, and general maintenance in and around lochdar.
